President Robert Smith called the April 2, 2024 regular council meeting of the Biglerville Borough Council to order at 7:00 p.m.

The following Council members were present: Robert Smith, John Angstadt, Neil Ecker, Janet L. Gliem, Robert Pantaleo, Robert E. Guise, Melinda Warren-Elnaggar, and Mayor Phil Wagner

The following guests were present: John Yadlosky; Citizen, Doug Hays; Water Operator; and, Chief Craig Hartley

WARREN-ELNAGGAR MADE A MOTION TO APPROVE MARCH 5, 2024 REGULAR MEETING MINUTES. PANTALEO SECONDED THE MOTION. MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

OPPORTUNITY FOR CITIZENS TO BE HEARD:

• John Yadlosky addressed council with the sewage backup that came up in the basement bathroom through the toilet and shower drain that occurred on January 9th at his residence at 130 Penn Street. Council asked Yadlosky questions and advised him that the Borough cares that this happened to his residence.

Yadlosky exited the meeting.

PLANNING COMMITTEE: Angstadt had nothing to report.

SEWER COMMITTEE: Gliem advised on

Gliem read the January sewer report.

- Treated total 9,545,000 gallons
- - Average per day 308,000 gallons
- - Weekly BOD, CBOD, Phosphorus, Ammonia Nitrogen, TSS, & Fecal Coliform samples
- - Weekly nitrate-nitrite & total nitrogen samples
- - Monthly Copper & Final Hardness samples
- - We had issues with the Influent screen this month. We found the problem to be the main shaft bolt had broken off inside the main shaft. We were able to drill & tap the old bolt out, and get back online in 3 or 4 days.
- - Off road diesel for the Generator at the STP was delivered this month. This is the back-up power for the STP.
- - We've been fighting an aeration issue for tank #1 for a while. We had Chamberlain & Wingert guys here on the 13th & 14th to help us figure out the issue. We televised the blower lines and found water inside the pipe on one side, and found the steel piping to be rusted through on the other side. Doug can explain. I would like to have the bad piping replaced with Schedule 80 pvc, and have attached a quote from Chamberlain & Wingert to do the work.
- Met with Knouse Foods employees to look over the sampling point set-up for their boiler water discharge. Have not seen any results from the lab yet.

Kevin Bollinger Water/Sewer Operator

- Gliem advised council that the annual Chapter 94 report was submitted to PA DEP ahead of the deadline and is currently under review.
- Gliem noted that KPI and Kevin are still waiting on the Knouse Foods boiler wastewater results.
- Gliem advised that we need to make a motion for the Envirep quote that was discussed at the March 5th meeting to repair the impeller at the sewer plant.

GLIEM MADE A MOTION TO APPROVE THE ENVIREP QUOTE FOR THE IMPELLER REPAIR AT THE STP IN THE AMOUNT OF \$5,180.24, INSTALLATION AND FREIGHT COSTS WILL BE ADDITIONAL. ECKER SECONDED THE MOTION. MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

• Gliem advised that blower lines at the STP are in need of repair. The lines were televised and water was found inside the pipe and the steel piping is rusted through on the one side. Kevin would like to have the bad piping replaced with schedule 80 PVC pipe. Chamberlin and Wingert provided a quote in the amount of \$12,000 to perform the pipe replacement.

GLIEM MADE A MOTION TO APPROVE THE CHAMBERLIN & WINGERT QUOTE IN THE AMOUNT OF \$12,000 TO REPAIR AND REPLACE BLOWER LINES AT THE STP. ANGSTADT SECONDED THE MOTION. MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

WATER COMMITTEE: Ecker read the water report

In March, our water system pumped a total of 2,574,000 gallons averaging 83,032 gal/day. That's a 9.5 % decrease from March 2023 and a 0.5 % increase from February 2024.

March's bacteria samples were taken on the 5th at 110 South Main Street.

(7-11 store), 38 West York Street (Adams County Surplus), and 363 Arendtsville Road (Nutrien). Also, on the same day the Floride sample for the I.O.C.'s at Well #7 had some issues. So, it was resampled. On the 12th I.O.C.s, Radium 226 and 228 were taken at Well #5. On the 20th I.O.C.s, Radium 226, Radium 228, and Combined Uranium were taken at Well #6

In March, water meters were read for the 1st quarter.

In March we had three final water meter readings, 39 Hillcrest Drive, 128 West Hanover Street and 112 Fourth Street.

The second round of residential backflow dead line is April 30. Doug wants to more on to the 3rd round. We will have a list of properties at May's council meeting, if the council is ready to move forward.

We have a quote from Ault Paving to repave a water leak repair at 124 South Main Street. The quote is attached to this report. (\$8,112.00). We need councils' permission to make this repair.

We have a quote from Ketterman Electric to install an outside light at the Well #5 sampling point building. The quote is attached (\$558.00) Doug's concerns are safety, security, and convenience. Money for this could be paid for under line item # 488.60

Doug would like to move forward with the sealcoating the black top at the water tank and Wells #6 & #7. We got a quote from Chris Minter. (\$7,285.00) This was put in the 2024 budget.

ECKER MADE A MOTION TO APPROVE THE KETTERMAN ELECTRIC QUOTE FOR \$558 FOR INSTALLATION OF A LIGHT OUTSIDE THE BUILDING AT WELL #5. GLIEM SECONDED THE MOTION. MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

ECKER MADE A MOTION TO ACCEPT AULT PAVING QUOTE IN THE AMOUNT OF \$8,112 TO REPAVE WATER LEAK REPAIR LOCATED AT 124 S MAIN STREET. GUISE SECONDED THE MOTION. MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

ECKER MADE A MOTION TO ACCEPT C. MINTER BLACKTOP & SEALCOATING QUOTE IN THE AMOUNT OF \$7,285 FOR SEALCOATING AT WATER TANK AND WELL 6 & 7. GUISE SECONDED THE MOTION. MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

FINANCE/PERSONNEL COMMITTEE: Smith reported on

Smith, Chair of Finance and Personnel committee called an executive session at 7:40 p.m. regarding personnel matters and returned to regular session at 8:03 p.m.

A MOTION WAS MADE BY SMITH, AS CHAIR OF FINANCE AND PERSONNEL, TO CHANGE THE MEDICARE PAYOUT FOR DOUG HAYS FROM DECEMBER 2024 TO APRIL 2024 IN THE AMOUNT OF \$2,000 AND TO INCREASE THE MEDICARE REIMBURSEMENT FOR DOUG HAYS BY 17% TO HELP OFFSET THE TAXES WITHHELD OF THE REIMBURSEMENT WITHIN AGREEANCE HAYS WOULD BE COMPLETING A NEW W4 FOR ADDITIONAL WITHHOLDING. ECKER SECONDED THE MOTION. MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

A MOTION WAS MADE BY SMITH, AS CHAIR OF FINANCE AND PERSONNEL TO ADOPT AND ADVERTISE THE RESOLUTION FOR DISPOSITION OF RECORDS. SECONDED BY ECKER. MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

A MOTION WAS MADE BY SMITH, AS CHAIR OF FINANCE AND PERSONNEL, TO ACCEPT COMCAST UPGRADE FOR THE BOROUGH OFFICE. THE NEW UPGRADE WILL BE \$287.99/MONTH FOR 24 MONTHS. SECONDED BY PANTALEO. MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

 Smith advised council that Craig Zack reached out to PennVest to see if there is a possibility for grant funding for the E. York Street water line replacement project. Zack was told by Tess Schlupp at PennVest that it would be possible for the Borough to reject the current offer from PennVest and reapply. However, if there were not any significant changes to the current debt and operating and maintenance costs since the original application was filed, the chances for a grant would not be likely.

A MOTION WAS MADE BY SMITH, AS CHAIR OF FINANCE AND PERSONNEL TO ACCEPT ROB PANTALEO'S RESIGNATION FROM NAREMA. SECONDED BY ECKER. MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

Rob asked council to begin thinking about a possible 3–5-year project that they may have in mind. That we have learned that the grant process is very time consuming and a process.
