The Biglerville Borough office is open Monday through Thursday from 7:30 am to 4:00 pm and Friday from 7:30 am to 12 noon, located at 33 Musselman Avenue. Welcome to the Biglerville Borough Community! On behalf of the Borough Council, Mayor, and Staff, we warmly welcome you and are pleased to provide you with important borough information to help you settle in and stay informed.

To stay informed of emergencies, the Borough office uses an automated phone system that sends alerts about emergencies, burn bans, snow emergencies, and reminders via phone call, SMS, or email. Residents should contact the Borough office to provide their phone and email addresses to receive these important notifications.

The Biglerville Borough Police Department, located at 33 Musselman Avenue, is staffed by two full-time sworn officers dedicated to ensuring safety for residents, businesses, and industry. For non-emergency concerns, residents can call 717-677-9101; in emergencies, dial 911. When officers are off duty, PA State Police provide emergency coverage for the Borough.

Biglerville Borough offers water and sewer services to the community with bills issued quarterly by mail or email, and residents can request email billing by contacting the Borough office. For additional details, refer to the attached information sheet, and for billing inquiries, contact the sewer and water operators at 717-677-8802. Payments can be made via check, money order, or online with a credit/debit card.

UTILITIES NOT HANDLED BY THE BOROUGH

Waste Connections is the waste collection and recycling provider for Biglerville Borough, with pickups scheduled every Monday morning and recycling every other week, including on Memorial Day and Independence Day; collection may be altered on other holidays. For questions, contact Waste Connections at 717-709-1700. The Borough hosts two e-recycle events annually in spring and fall, with details posted on our website and Facebook.

Residents are asked to place garbage containers at the curb or street/alley right-of-way no more than 24 hours before collection and to remove them within 12 hours after pickup per the Borough ordinance.

Met-Ed, a First Energy Company, supplies electricity to our Borough. For customer service inquiries, contact Met-Ed at 1-800-545-7741. In case of a power outage, please call 1-888-544-4877.

BOROUGH ORDINANCE ITEMS

When mowing your lawn, please avoid projecting grass clippings onto the road or sidewalk; if this occurs, promptly clean them up to maintain safety. Additionally, according to ordinance, grass and weeds should not exceed 8 inches in height.

In accordance with ordinance, residents must clear a minimum 36-inch-wide path on sidewalks within 24 hours after snow or ice stops falling during snowstorms or squalls. Additionally, please spread sand, salt, or abrasive material to prevent slips and falls, and avoid piling or throwing snow onto the street, near fire hydrants, or storm drains to ensure safety and proper drainage.

Before starting home improvement projects, residents should check whether permits are required by contacting the Borough office or visiting our website, where information on code enforcement, zoning, and all necessary permits is readily available for easy access.
